NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON THE DESIGN AND ENVIRONMENTAL ASPECTS AND NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY OF AN ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENT FOR THE PROPOSED IMPROVEMENT OF COUNTY HIGHWAY S BETWEEN COUNTY HIGHWAY H AND BRUMBACK BOULEVARD KENOSHA COUNTY

ALL INTERESTED PERSONS are advised that Kenosha County will hold a public hearing as provided by law to consider the design and environmental aspects of the proposed improvement along County Highway S from County Highway H to Brumback Boulevard (Phase 1 project), including those aspects that may require application to the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers for the placement of fill materials into waters of the United States. Information regarding the section of County Highway S from the Interstate 94 East Frontage Road (120th Avenue) to County Highway H (Phase 2 project) will also be available at the public hearing.

The goal of the project is to improve safety and capacity, and reduce congestion by reconstructing the two lane rural roadway with a four lane divided roadway (expanded north), adding turn lanes, replacing traffic signals, adding bicycle and pedestrian accommodations with a multi-use path, and improving drainage. A second bridge over the Canadian Pacific Railroad would be constructed to carry one direction of traffic. The existing box culvert carrying the South Branch Pike Creek under County Highway S would be extended north to accommodate the wider roadway. County Highway EA would be relocated 250-ft west of its current intersection with County Highway S to provide additional separation from the Union Pacific Railroad. Anticipated real estate acquisitions would include 11 property relocations, approximately 44.6 acres of fee, and approximately 7.9 acres of temporary grading easements.

The public hearing will be held on Thursday, September 20, 2018, at the Kenosha County Center, 19600 75th Avenue, Bristol Wisconsin. The public hearing will be conducted from 4:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. Interested persons may attend anytime between 4:30 p.m. and 7:30 p.m. to review displays and other hearing materials, ask questions, and provide testimony.

The traditional-style portion of the public hearing will begin at 5:30 p.m. with an informational project presentation prior to accepting traditional-style testimony from the public and will end when all interested persons have provided testimony or 7:30 p.m., whichever occurs first.

The meeting facility is wheelchair accessible. Deaf or hard of hearing persons needing assistance should contact the Wisconsin Telecommunications Relay System (dial 711).

Kenosha County project staff and the engineering consultant, raSmith, will be available for informal discussion to explain the proposed improvements and answer questions. Exhibits of the proposal will be on display and a statement about the proposed improvement will be available for review.

All interested persons are invited to attend the hearing and to present relevant verbal and/or written testimony concerning the detailed design aspects of the proposed improvement; the social, economic, and environmental impacts and effects of the proposed improvement including those impacts and effects for which permit application to the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers may be required pursuant to Section 404 of the Federal Clean Water Act (5.17 acres of wetland impact are anticipated); and whether

the improvement is or is not in the public interest and consistent with the goals and objectives of area planning.

Land acquisition and schedules for construction will be discussed at the public hearing.

Relocation assistance will also be discussed. It is anticipated that the relocation of persons and businesses will occur as a result of the proposed improvement.
