**BACKGROUND:**

In the fall of 2024, the Public Works Department submitted a 2025 CIP request for a Bucket Truck at a price of \$250,000. After discussion with the Village Board the funds were approved for the 2025 budget, on the condition that the purchase would be rediscussed in front of the Village Board before the purchase was approved to be made.

**UPDATE:**

At this time, the Public Works has reevaluated the purchase of the bucket truck and does not believe that now is the time for the purchase to be made. Instead, Public Works would like to reallocate the approved 2025 funds to move up CIP purchases that were planned to be submitted for 2026. These include a 2025 Ford 4x4 F550 1-Ton truck with dump box, snowplow, and salter, that would be replacing a current 2005 Chevy one-ton truck with dump box, snowplow and salter. A 2025 Ford 4x4 Super Cab pickup with snowplow, that would be replacing a 2008 GMC 2WD pickup. And lastly, a 3-Ton Falcon Asphalt Recycler & Hot Box, that would be replacing a 2010 2-Ton Falcon Recycler and Hot Box.

**COMMENTS:**

Pricing for the equipment is as follows:

- 2025 Ford 4x4 F550 1-Ton: Chassis \$61,047, Monroe Equipment upfitting: \$63,772 = \$124,819
- 2025 Ford 4x4 Super Cab pickup with snowplow: \$67,317
- 3-Ton Falcon Hot Box: \$39,175.50

Total cost of three pieces of equipment = \$231,311.50

With \$250,000 originally allocated for the bucket truck, that would leave \$18,688.50 to be rolled into 2026 CIP funds.

RECCOMENDATION:

To approve the reallocation of \$250,00 in 2025 CIP funds from the purchase of a bucket truck to the purchase of a 2025 Ford 4x4 F550 1-Ton truck with dump box, snowplow, and salter, a 2025 Ford 4x4 Super Cab pickup with snowplow, and a 3-Ton Falcon Asphalt Recycler & Hot Box.

Excessive noise shall include, but shall not be limited to, loud playing of phonographs, tape players, radios, television sets or other recorded music or musical instruments and construction activities which generate unnecessary or excessive noise.”*

**COMMENTS:**

If the Board wishes to change the current ordinance or draft a new ordinance addressing construction, Administration will direct the Village Attorney to do so. The Board should be specific as to the times, locations and type of activities that are being regulated.

A modern, sign-up-based monthly e-newsletter would improve communication with residents, local businesses, and potential developers by delivering timely and relevant updates directly to subscribers.

Benefits of a Monthly E-Newsletter:

- Direct Communication – Email alerts are delivered straight to subscribers’ inboxes — eliminating the need to check the website manually.
- Higher Engagement – Monthly updates are more likely to be read when they arrive automatically.
- Broad Accessibility — Any interested party — residents, business owners, developers — can opt in to stay informed.
- Timely Information – Monthly frequency allows for more current updates and reduces communication delays.
- Responsive Messaging – Supports urgent updates such as weather cancellations, road closures, public notices, or event reminders.

- Simple to Maintain – Easy-to-use templates make it possible for staff to produce newsletters without needing design expertise.

- Frustration Among Users – Residents and visitors struggle to find accurate and up-to-date information.
- Lack of Representation – Although our village is vibrant and active, the current site does not reflect this energy or community spirit.

To move forward, staff is requesting direction from the Board on the following action items:

- Establish a Website Committee - Form a committee to work with Dooley & Associates in identifying key website features, layout updates, essential content, and overall structure improvements.
- Designate a Website Manager - Identify a staff member who will be responsible for maintaining and managing the website going forward.

**BACKGROUND:**

Addressing the Village's ZIP Code issues was a 2022 Goal for the Village. As you are aware, Somers' residents have 13 different ZIP Codes from seven different municipalities.

On Oct. 25, 2022, the Village adopted resolution 2022-017 requesting a ZIP Code Boundary Review. That application was submitted to the United States Postal Service that fall. The Boundary Review was officially denied November 2024. In December of that year, an appeal was filled with the USPS.

At the March 26, 2024, the Village voted to hire a lobbyist and shared cost with other municipalities up to \$10,000 for a duration of two months. The Village was billed \$9,375.00. At that time, the ZIP Code Bill was stuck in the Oversight Committee. The combined efforts of the lobbyist we retained and the visit that Trustee Ostby and other representatives from our ZIP Code Advocacy Coalition was invaluable in moving the Bill out of committee. It was brought to the floor of the house. At that time, Congresswoman Boebert spoke on the floor in favor of the Bill and mentioned Somers by name. A video is available at this link:

US Congressman Steil requested new resolutions from the Village to help move the Bills out of Committee. The Village and the Town approved Resolutions supporting Bills introduced in the 119<sup>th</sup> Congress at their respective meetings on May 13. Those new resolutions have been sent to the Congressman's office as he renews his efforts to bring our Bill to a vote.

We have held regular meetings with other municipalities with ZIP Code issues to coordinate efforts. We have gathered national attention. Our coalition has grown and now includes additional municipalities facing the same issue as Somers. Some of those have expressed strong interest in hiring a lobbyist again.

On May 21, Board approved joining with other municipalities in hiring a lobbyist and sharing cost up to \$10,000. Members of the National coalition are working on a Request For Proposal. Staff will inform the Board once more information is available from municipalities.

On May 21, Bill H.R. 3095, which includes the Village of Somers and more than 60 other communities, passed the Oversight Committee and will proceed in the legislative review process. Senate Bill 1455, which also includes the Village of Somers, has been introduced in the Senate.

#### UPDATE:

Village President Stoner received a letter dated June 11, 2025 from USPS City Delivery Strategy & Policy Director Timothy Haney offering the Preferred Last Line to residents within the ZIP Codes 53405, 53141, 53406, 53158, 53140, 53143, 53177, 53171, 53126, 53142, 53403, 53140 and 53144.

#### COMMENTS:

The Preferred Last Line option would not achieve some of the goals that a unique ZIP Code would (change to insurance rates, increase awareness of our community by developers, registration of vehicles in the Village, etc.)

Staff has contacted the Village of Caledonia to find out how that process works. They mentioned that it was a lengthy process. Administration is looking for direction from the Board as to whether to contact USPS to discuss implementation details.

Dear President Stoner:

After reviewing your request for a unique ZIP Code for Somers municipality, I concur with the district's decision to deny the request. Currently, Somers has a unique ZIP Code assigned for Post Office Boxes. Following a feasibility study, we determined that addressing service concerns, cost implications, and the operational requirements for carrier territory adjustments would not be viable at this time. While we understand the importance of this request, maintaining the existing ZIP Code structure remains in the best interest of all stakeholders.

Preserving ZIP Code stability is essential for ensuring efficient and accurate mail delivery. Requests for ZIP Code boundary adjustments undergo thorough evaluation to balance local needs with broader operational considerations.

As an alternative, the district is offering a solution to support community identification. Residents within ZIP Codes 53405, 53141, 53406, 53158, 53104, 53143, 53177, 53171, 53126, 53142, 53403, 53140, and 53144 may utilize Somers as the Preferred Last Line (PLL) or Alternate Last Line town name in their mailing addresses while retaining their assigned ZIP Code. This approach allows residents to reflect their community affiliation without requiring a formal ZIP Code realignment. However, customers must continue using their designated ZIP Codes in official addresses to prevent mail delays or returns.

To discuss the implementation details—specific to individual addresses and blocks in these areas—please contact Lisa Wojnarowski, Manager, Address Management Systems, at (414) 287-2566. Should circumstances change in the future, we are open to reevaluating the situation.
