AGENDA ITEM: #6 Action on Final Payment Request by C.W. Purpero for the Neumiller Woods Phase II Stormwater Utility Projects in the amount of 42,007.00.

BACKGROUND:

Gitzlaff Park is a 24-acre parcel that was donated to the Village of Somers by Larry Gitzlaff in 2007. Root-Pike Win and the Village have worked together over the past few years to restore the North half of Gitzlaff Park. Phase I of the project was completed by Root Pike Win securing a \$125,000 grant from the Fund for Lake Michigan and U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service for the project's design and construction. No Village funds were used for design, construction, or short-term maintenance of Phase I. The project included the removal of invasive species, wetland scrapes and plantings. The improvements will serve to reduce flooding, curb erosion, increase water quality, diversify vegetation, and boost pollinators along the Somers Branch.

In 2021, the Village approved Resolution 2021-026 for Root Pike Win securing an implementation grant for Phase II at Gitzlaff Park. Phase II was originally allocated in our approved 2022 Budget. The Board also passed Resolution 2022-014 that stated that the Village would continue to work with Root, Pike Win to complete Phase II of both the Gitzlaff project and Neumiller Woods project.

Since 2021 Root Pike Win has been working as the Village's agent to complete Phase II of both projects. The Board has set aside money in the stormwater CIP for both projects. In 2025 CIP, \$40,000 was set aside for Neumiller phase II and \$31,711 for Gitzlaff Phase II. The \$31,711 is carry over from the \$50,000 that was set aside in past CIP budgets.

In January the projects were noticed for bid and were opened on February 3rd, 2025. The low responsible bidder was C.W. Purpero out of Oak Creek, Wisconsin at \$196,886.

Root Pike Win has provided a summary of the funding for the projects.

This project was made possible by cost savings from combining the Neumiller and Gitzlaff projects together. It has been on the CIP for a few years. It is funded through Grants administered by Root Pike WIN. The Villages pays the contractor and is reimbursed through the grants.

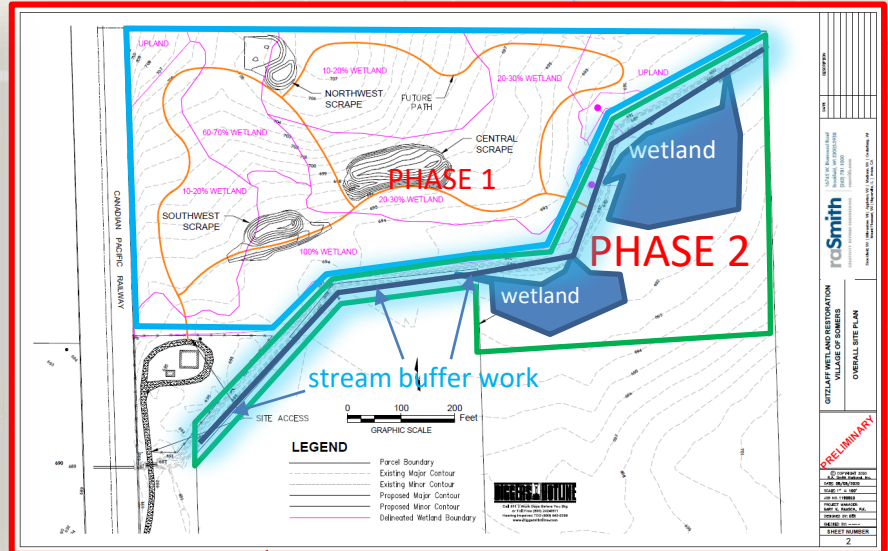
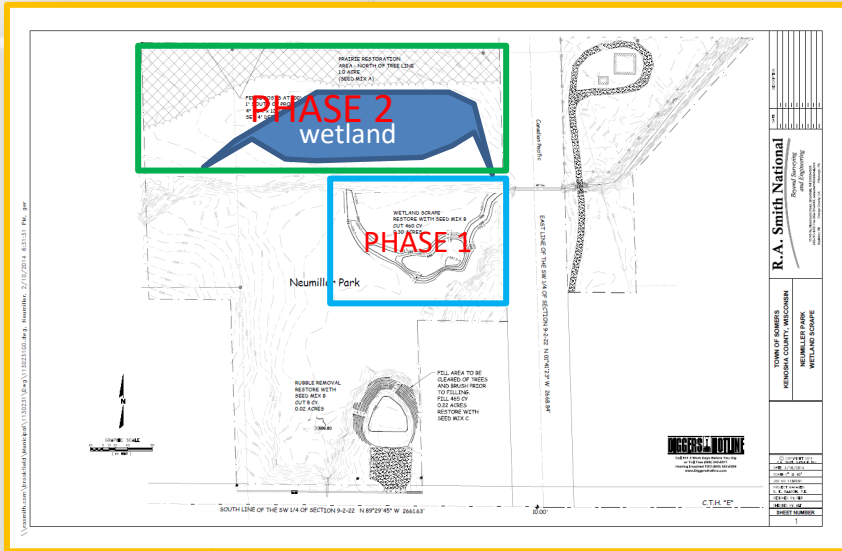

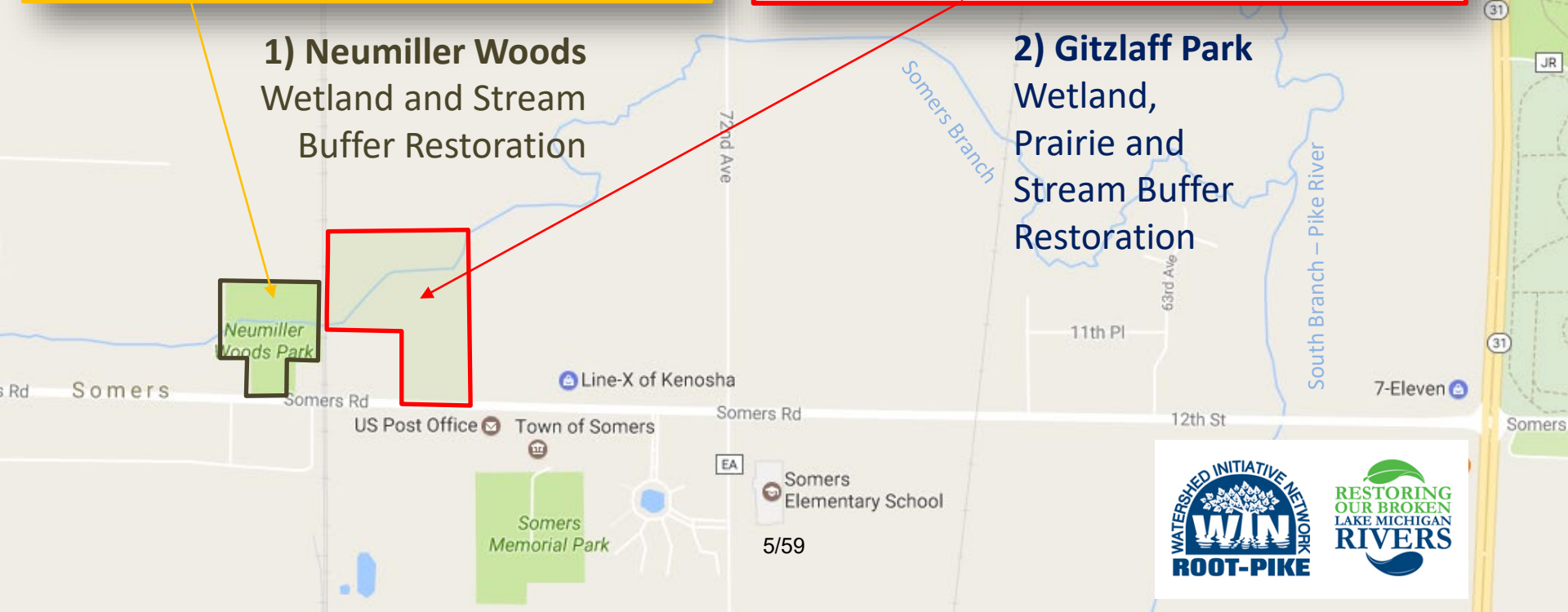

Neumiller Woods and Gitzlaff Park: Restoration Phases



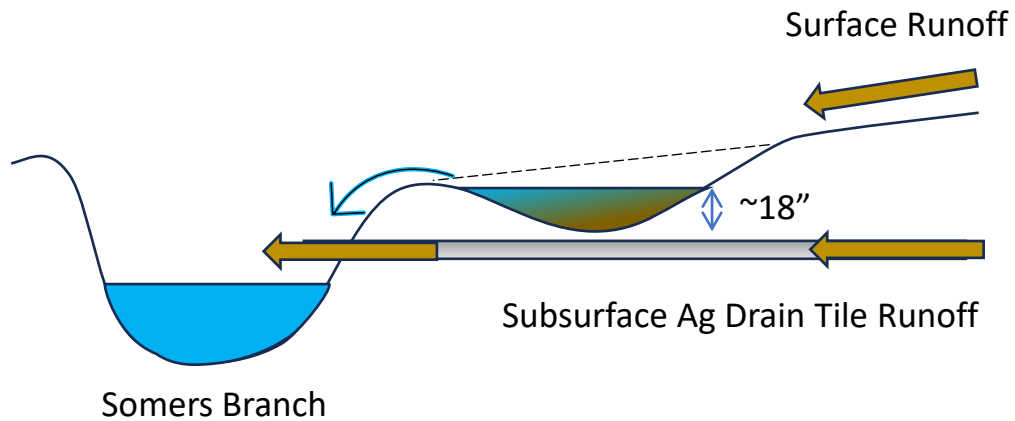
1) Neumiller Woods Wetland and Stream Buffer Restoration

2) Gitzlaff Park Wetland, Prairie and Stream Buffer Restoration



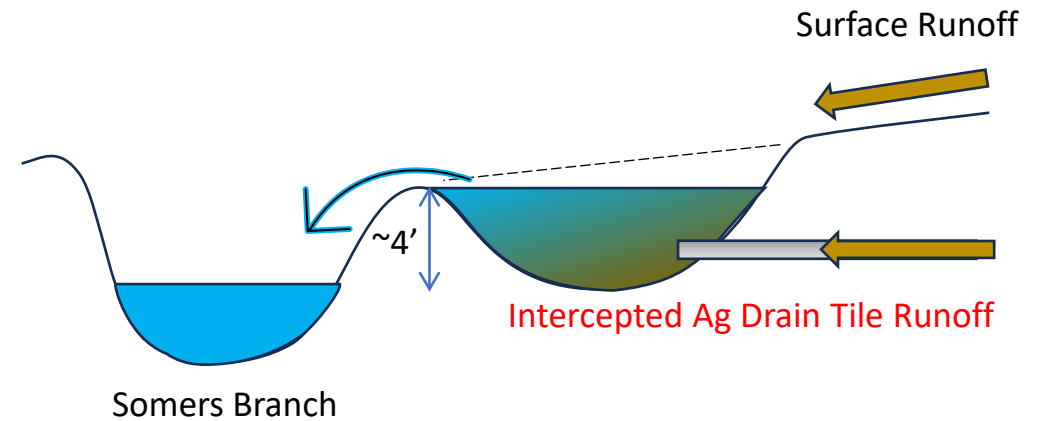
Gitzlaff Park – Phase Two Wetland Pond Options

OPTIMIZED DESIGN “POND”

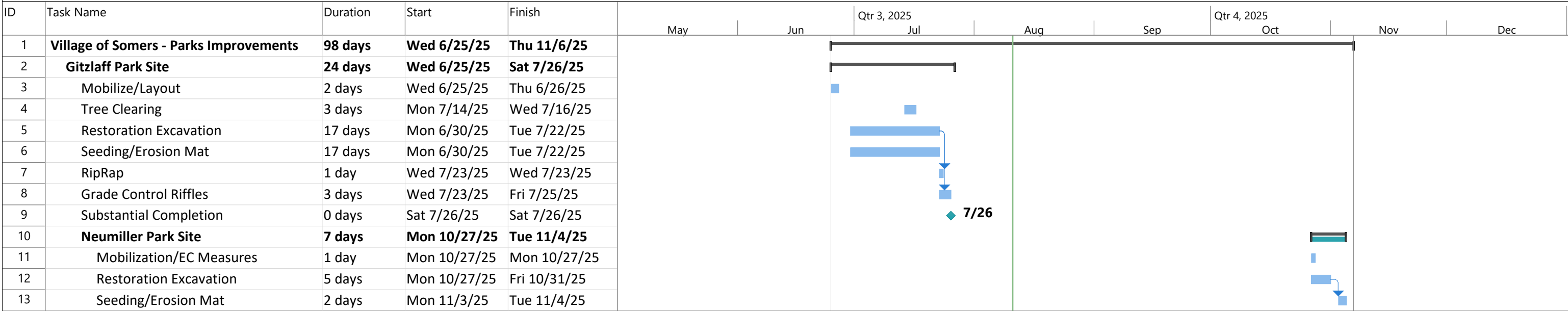
