Re: Revision to the March 30, 2026 Request by the Municipal Judge to Approve
the 2026 Bond Book including the \$10 Increase to the Court Costs

Dear Village President Stoner, Town Chairperson Molinaro, Village Trustees, and Town Supervisors:

Municipalities must have deposit schedules for violations of their ordinances (such deposit schedules commonly called “bond books”). A “deposit” (commonly called a “bond”) is the approved amount a violator can post to conclude the case without coming to court.

On March 30, 2026, I wrote to you regarding the change in state law allowing your municipalities to reclaim more of their expenses through increasing court costs. To practically implement the change, an amendment of the “bond book” for each municipality was necessary. (While an amendment to the Village bond book was possible, no one was able at the time of my original correspondence, or since has been able, to find an existing bond book for the Town.)

From a significant review of the headings and a cursory comparison of your respective ordinances, it appeared that with a minor difference, they were essentially identical. To make it easier on the Sheriff’s Department, I endeavored in the attachments to my prior correspondence with you to make a combined bond book for the Village and the Town.

Your new prosecutor, Christopher Schultz, brought to my attention a discrepancy between the forfeitures allowed between your two municipalities (*i.e.*, the maximum base forfeiture for the vast majority of disorderly-conduct type violations of Town ordinances is limited \$200, with a maximum cap on the majority of other ordinances at \$500). I have taken a much deeper, multi-hour dive into the comparison of the ordinances. In addition to the forfeiture structure, there are also some substantive differences (by way of examples, the prohibition on heavy truck traffic is in a similarly numbered Section 7.15 in each ordinance book, but the violation is found in Subsection A of the Town ordinance and in Subsection B of the Village ordinance, and further, the Town does not regulate unnecessary acceleration as the Village does in its Section 9.28).

I therefore am providing revised, segregated versions of respected bond books for both the Village and for the Town.

Village

Attached as Revised Exhibit A is the bond book for ordinance violations for your review and approval. From the prior version, I removed references to the Town and added a few more sections for clarity for the deputies as they use the book. I have also attached as Revised Exhibit B a redline version to show changes from the bond book that existed prior to the statutory change. As previously noted to you, the vast majority of the changes reflect an increase in court costs authorized by the state. The other changes are identified both in the redline version and more specifically identified in Exhibit C.

Town

I have attached as Exhibit D the proposed bond book for the Town. As I could not find an existing bond book, there is no redline version I can provide to you as I did with the Village.

Request

I request that both the Village and Town approve their respective deposit schedules. The Village and the Town each have an ordinance §1.10 B(5)(c)(i), which provides:

The Municipal Judge shall establish and submit to the [Village/Town] Board for approval in accordance with § 800.03(3), Wis. Stats., a schedule of deposits for violation of Village Ordinances, Resolutions and By-Laws

As previously indicated, the law makes the establishment of the deposits the province of the municipal judge. It is the prerogative of the Boards to approve or not what is presented. For the largest part, I have accepted the base forfeitures the Village Board previously approved, and to the extent possible given the different forfeiture structure, carried them over to the Town. If you have changes you would like to have me to consider, please let me know.


As also previously indicated, I am delaying immediate effect to enable collaboration with the Sheriff's Department in an effort to give that Department some leadtime to update their citation-issuing software.

I propose a version of the following motion:

“To approve the Deposit Schedule presented by the Municipal Judge made pursuant to the ordinances, also known colloquially as the Bond Book, which will become effective upon order of the Municipal Court.”
